WEEKLY SESSION NOTES

Monday, September 27, 2021

Bills voted on Third Consideration:

<u>SB 153</u> (LANGERHOLC) amends the Vehicle Code to increase the weight of electric powered trucks from 80,000 pounds to 82,000 pounds to accommodate the weight of the battery or battery pack. <u>PASSED: 48-1.</u>

<u>HB 523</u> (DAY) amends the General Road Law to clarify maintenance responsibilities for private roads and provide the right to civil action. <u>PASSED: 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 636</u> (BAKER) authorizes a lease agreement with Wayne County for land and improvements at the State Correctional Institution – Waymart in Canaan Township and Waymart Borough, Wayne County. <u>PASSED: 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 673</u> (**DUSH**) amends the Second Class Township Code regarding the surcharge of township officials and the appointment of a township manager. <u>PASSED: 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 795</u> (**DUSH**) authorizes the conveyance of land, buildings, structures and improvements in Richmond Township, Tioga County. <u>PASSED: 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 738</u> (PHILLIPS-HILL) amends the Election Code to provide for the online posting of constitutional amendments. PASSED: 43-6.

<u>SB 764</u> (ARGALL) amends the Administrative Code to require legislative process training for the Department of State. **PASSED: 36-13.**

Bills amended:

<u>SB 725</u> (BARTOLOTTA) amends Title 75 (Vehicles) to allow drivers to operate a farm vehicle with a Class C driver's license. **OVER AS AMENDED.**

<u>A02337</u> (BARTOLOTTA) adds drivers with a class A and B license to those who may operate a farm vehicle. <u>AGREED TO.</u>

<u>SB 236</u> (BROOKS) amends the Telemarketer Registration Act (Act 147 of 1996) regarding robocalls and spoofing. **AMENDED AND RE-COMMITTED TO APPROPRIATIONS.**

A01952 (BROOKS) adds a definition for "legal holiday." AGREED TO.

Tuesday, September 28, 2021

Bills voted on Third Consideration:

<u>SB 396</u> (BARTOLOTTA) designates the Mrs. Madeline Finney Memorial Bridge in Washington County. <u>PASSED</u> 49-0.

<u>SB 725</u> (BARTOLOTTA) amends Title 75 (Vehicles) to allow drivers to operate a farm vehicle with a Class A, B, or C driver's license. **PASSED 49-0.**

<u>SB 729</u> (J. WARD) amends the Nurse Aide Resident Abuse Prevention Training Act to permit the delivery of resident abuse training programs for nurse aides in various platforms. **PASSED 49-0.**

<u>SB 736</u> (LANGERHOLC) amends Title 75 (Vehicles) to authorize the transportation of agricultural products to a place of residence with a truck bearing a farm vehicle plate. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 867</u> (BAKER) designates the Kunkle Firefighter Edward L. Nulton, Sr., Memorial Highway in Wyoming and Luzerne Counties. PASSED 49-0.

SB 880 (SCAVELLO) designates the Samuel Newman Way in Monroe County with a related repeal. PASSED 49-0.

<u>HB 1591</u> (KNOWLES) amends the County Code, to maintain the current classification of every county regardless of population changes reflected in the 2020 census and retain existing classifications until the 2030 census, unless a county chooses to adopt a change in classification. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 859</u> (LANGERHOLC) amends Title 75 (Vehicles) to extend the temporary regulations for the school bus stop arm camera enforcement program. <u>PASSED: 49-0.</u>

Wednesday, September 29, 2021

Bills voted on Third Consideration:

<u>SB 869</u> (**TOMLINSON**) amends Title 63 (Professionals and Occupations (State Licensed)) to provide for virtual board and commission meetings, quorums, continuing education and supervision. <u>PASSED: 48-0.</u>

HB 1182 (SCHLEGEL-CULVER) amends the Barbers' License Law to provide for distance education. PASSED: 48-0.

HB 1183 (SCHLEGEL-CULVER) amends the Cosmetology Law to provide for distance education. PASSED: 48-0.

<u>HB 1861</u> (LEWIS) amends the Administrative Code to extend the suspension of certain statutes, rules, and regulations determined to be necessary to manage COVID-19 and requires each authorizing agency to issue a final report relating to the suspended statutes, rules, and regulations. **PASSED: 48-0.**

Bills voted on Concurrence with House amendments:

<u>SB 397</u> (PITTMAN) amends the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act to update the provisions related to physician assistants. <u>AMENDMENTS CONCURRED IN: 48-0.</u>

<u>SB 398</u> (PITTMAN) amends the Medical Practice Act of 1985 to update provisions related to physician assistant. <u>AMENDMENTS CONCURRED IN: 48-0.</u>
