Monday, April 11, 2022

Bill voted on Third Consideration:

HB 221 (RADER) Amends Act 442 of 1968 (1967) by permitting open space tax funds to be used to maintain open space property not acquired under the Act. PASSED 46-2.

Bills amended on Third Consideration:

<u>SB 284</u> (YAW) Amends Title 27 (Environmental Resources) to provide for bonding of Alternative Energy Production Projects, and for the prevention of solar forced labor. <u>AMENDED and REREFFERED TO APPROPRIATIONS.</u>

A03899 (MUTH) Allows the Environmental Quality Board to promulgate regulations establishing or revising the bonding requirements for an owner or operator of a conventional or unconventional well. It would also increase the current bonding requirement to reflect the actual cost for plugging each well operated or owned – conventional well would be determined to be no less than \$30,000 per well and an unconventional well would be determined to be no less than \$80,000 per well. FAILED 19-29.

<u>A03939</u> (YAW) Establishes a decommissioning process for solar energy facilities; provide financial assurance requirements in solar energy facility agreements; and forced labor prevention regulations. <u>ADOPTED 47-1.</u>

<u>SB 597</u> (STEFANO) Amends the Public Utility Code to provide for water and wastewater asset management plans. <u>OVER AS AMENDED.</u>

<u>A03946</u> (STEFANO) Shifts oversight from the Public Utility Commission to Department of Environmental Protection. <u>ADOPTED 38-10.</u>

<u>A03975</u> (STEFANO) Requires the Department of Environmental Protection to promulgate regulations. <u>ADOPTED 34-14.</u>

Bill amended on Supplemental Calendar:

<u>SB 1179</u> (BAKER) Amends the Domestic and Sexual Violence Victim Address Confidentiality Act by extending address confidentiality to victims of child abduction and victims of human trafficking. <u>OVER</u> **AS AMENDED**

<u>A03982</u> (BAKER) – Removes "victim of child abduction" definition and replaces it with definition of "victim of kidnapping" within the legislation as well as changing references of term "abduction" to "kidnapping." **AGREED TO.**

Tuesday, April 12, 2022

Bills voted on Third Consideration:

SB 118 (K. WARD) Amends Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) to require registration under Megan's Law for those individuals convicted of offenses involving human trafficking, patronizing a victim of sexual servitude, and involuntary servitude. PASSED 47-2.

<u>SB 962</u> (LANGERHOLC) Establishes the Rural Coworking and Innovation Center Grant Program by creating a competitive grant program within the Department of Community and Economic Development for the construction or renovation of a facility, extending and improving utility and broadband service connections, and the purchase equipment, furniture, and security systems for coworking centers in rural counties or rural municipalities. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 1040</u> (BROWNE) Amends the Crime Victims Act by requiring law enforcement to make reasonable efforts to notify a murder victim's surviving family members before publicly releasing the victim's identity. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 1047</u> (GEBHARD) Amends Title 51 (Military Affairs) to replace outdated sections in the Military and Veterans Code which includes making updates to the State Armory Board. **PASSED 49-0.**

<u>SB 1172</u> (VOGEL) Enacts the Sexual Assault Emergency Services Act by allowing hospitals to establish Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) programs and enabling a grant program for the establishment and support of SANE programs. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

SB 1179 (BAKER) Amends the Domestic and Sexual Violence Victim Address Confidentiality Act by extending address confidentiality to victims of kidnapping and human trafficking. **PASSED 49-0.**

Bill voted on Supplemental Calendar:

<u>SB 284</u> (YAW) Amends Title 27 (Environmental Resources) to provide for decommissioning of solar energy facilities. <u>PASSED 35-14</u>.

Wednesday, April 13, 2022

Bills voted on Third Consideration:

<u>SB 982</u> (L. BAKER) Amends the Election Code to prohibit private contributions for the administration of elections. <u>PASSED 37-12.</u>

<u>SB 1016</u> (MASTRIANO) Amends Title 51 (Military Affairs) to permit the awarding of military decorations to members of strategic allies. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

<u>SB 1167</u> (DISANTO) Amends Title 12 (Commerce and Trade) to authorize financial institutions and insurers to provide services to legitimate cannabis-related businesses, prohibit adverse state regulatory or legal actions. <u>PASSED 46-3.</u>

<u>SB 1200</u> (DUSH) Amends the Election Code to clarify delivery locations for mail-in and absentee ballots. **PASSED 29-20.**

<u>HB 2058</u> (MAKO) Amends the Local Tax Enabling Act by aligning the filing deadlines of certain local tax returns with the filing deadline for state income tax returns. <u>PASSED 49-0.</u>

Bill voted on Concurrence on Supplemental Calendar

<u>SB 1020</u> (GEBHARD) Authorizes land conveyances in Lebanon County and Montgomery/Chester County. **CONCURRED IN HOUSE AMENDMENTS 49-0.**
